## Pastor's Corner...



The Pastoral Call Process and Expectations of the Pastor and of the Congregation

Being in a time of transition is difficult. Congregations like Holy Cross in the pastoral call

process have hopes and expectations for the long-term pastor to come. Those hopes and expectations may be reflected in questions like:

- What will he or she be like? Will she be a good preacher? Will he be warm and caring?
- How will he or she guide the council or other leaders within the church?
- How will he or she support the ministries and leaders we currently have in place and, with them, consider new forms of ministry?

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#### Pastor's Corner (cont'd)

 How will he or she be a leader in the wider community? What ties or relationships will he or she form and how will that connect us to our community?

The pastor candidate has hopes and expectations, too, of ministry in and with a new congregation:

- What has been happening in this congregation in the last 5 years or last 1 year?
- How do they treat each other? When they have different ideas about how to "be church," how do they work that out?
- How do they welcome newcomers?
- What new ministries have they begun in the last 2-3 years?
- How do they reach out to their community in mission and service?
- If I were to share an idea that was new to them, how might that be received? How do they work in partnership with their pastor? What kind of relationship did they have with their previous pastor?
- How does the makeup of the congregation reflect the surrounding community?
- Could I see myself being in ministry with them?
- I have choices: Is this where I want to be? Would I want to bring my family to this place?

During a recent sermon, I proposed that dynamic ministry is dependent upon pastor and members working together as followers of Jesus, blessed and guided by the Holy Spirit as they seek to make known God's love for the world. God bless you as you engage in dynamic ministry now and as you seek to continue to do so in partnership with the new, long-term pastor when he or she comes.

Martin Luther Prayer. Pastor Scott provided informative and
educational material regarding how a Pastor's compensation package is developed.

We received the following reports: Pastor's report, Finance, Maintenance, Call Committee, Bible Camp, Godly Play/Sunday School and Emergency Operations Task Force.

The ELCA wide, God's Work Our Hand's Sunday, September 9 was finalized. There are 4 service opportunities.

The Council has developed and approved the Council Organization Structure, supporting how the Congregation structures itself to accomplish its mission. Specific Holy Cross Ministry areas are identified and a liaison process to enhance communication between the Council and Church Committees and groups is established. Five Specific Ministry Areas are established; Worship and Music; Education and Learning; Outreach and Service; Fellowship; and Administrative Support. During August and September council members will contact and visit with the identified Chairs of the various committees and groups in these areas. The purpose of this initial meeting is to learn about the work of these committees and groups, discuss how the group has contributed to the achievement of our Strategic Plan goals, offer council support-ask what the council can do to support their ministry work. Council will summarize the reports from these meetings looking for common threads and trends and opportunities. This information will be shared with the Council, committees and congregation.

On an ongoing basis, the Council Liaison will be the contact point for the various Committees/Groups.

They will meet periodically, sharing information and providing assistance for reports to and requests of the Council. The goal of this liaison organization structure is to continue to strengthen the communication and Ministry Work of Holy Cross, working together to achieve our Mission: To "Worship God and Follow Christ's call to discipleship as we give of ourselves to the community and those in need worldwide" and to live our Vision: Believe in One, Affect Many, Welcome All.



LEAN: LEAN is an acronym which stands for Lutheran Engagement and Advocacy in Nevada. LEAN's mission is to advocate for the common good and promote public policies that reflect the Christian values of peacemaking, hospitality to strangers, care for creation, and concern for people living in poverty and struggling with hunger and disease. It advocates through the Nevada legislature in keeping with policy positions in the Social Statements developed by the Evangelical Church in America (ELCA).

In August, Holy Cross members Diane Ludlow and Veralyn Combs and Pastor Scott Trevithick participated in a LEAN coordinated event called U Legislate, which is a mock legislative experience for people to see what it's like to be a state Senator. Two actual bills that went through the 2017 Session were debated as a way of learning that both sides of an issue have valid concerns, that reasonable people can compromise, and that clear analysis and articulate discussion are real assets. The bills were SB 194 (addressing products from endangered species) and SB 32 (passing a civics test in order to graduate from high school). LEAN's Advocate and Director is Bill Ledford.
