

#### **Reflecting the Hospitality of God...**

The church season of Advent begins Sunday, December 2 and extends for four Sundays. As we begin worship over these Sundays and then continue on Christmas Eve and the first Sunday of Christmas on December 30th, we will light the Advent and Christ candles and hear words of scripture reminding us of the longing of the people for a savior. We find this hope fulfilled in the coming of Jesus, who is Emmanuel, God with us. As the Gospel writer John says, "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14).

As followers of Jesus, we demonstrate this love of God for the world when we likewise extend hospitality to welcome others as we ourselves know God's love for us. A tangible way we at Holy Cross can extend this hospitality during this season is to invite others to join us for worship and special events and to actively welcome others when they come. We will have a basket of invitations on the ushers' table in the narthex/welcome space for you to give or mail to a friend or neighbor. Events include the following:

#### Sunday Mornings in the Advent Season

December 2, 9, 16, and 23 at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. Join us for worship with Advent candle wreath lighting and Communion. On the second Sunday of Advent, Dec. 9, we will bless handmade quilts for infants in Renown's Neo-natal Intensive Care Unit. On the third Sunday of Advent, Dec. 16, children from Godly Play and their leaders will help lead the service.

#### Live Nativity Friday and Saturday December 14 & 15. Drop in from 6-8 p.m.

A tradition of over 35 years! Help us tell the story of our Savior's birth with scripture, costumes, and maybe even some live barnyard animals. Warm up with chili, apple cider, and hot chocolate afterwards.

#### New Pastor Fund for moving expenses—Update

To date gifts totaling \$3600 have been given to the New Pastor Fund. Thank you! All interview expenses were paid from the 2018 call committee budget.

# Live Nativity



It's been a tradition that members and visitors alike look forward to and one by which many in the broader Reno-Sparks community identify Holy Cross. It's happening this year Friday December 14th and Saturday the 15th from 6 – 8 p.m. both evenings. The highlight is people dressing in costume to tell the story of Jesus' birth alongside real barnyard animals. Financial performance and Budget information - YTD- September 30, 2018

We are below budgeted levels in the General Fund income and Total income. However, we are under budget in expenses. This results in a loss at the end of the third quarter. We experienced slower revenue during the summer months. The revenue trend rebounds in the fall, and we have seen increased giving in October. However, we have not met our projected revenue levels as we enter the Christmas Season.

This matching opportunity will run until the match is met or Jan. 31, 2019, whichever comes first.



## Looking for Volunteer Opportunities in the New Year?

Here are some ideas . . .

In November, a number of folks from Holy Cross went to tour the facilities in Reno on Record Street and learn about the programs of Volunteers of America for those who are working

poor, homeless, and otherwise in need. VOA operates a Men's shelter, Women's Shelter, Family Shelter, an off-site overflow shelter, and a general Resource Center. The mission of VOA is "To change individual lives, instill hope, increase self-worth and facilitate independence, through quality housing, employment, and related supportive services." We met with Linda Grace, Regional Development Officer for VOA. (Email: Lgrace@VOA-ncnn.org and phone (775) 322-7143) and others on the staff, some of whom are graduates of their "Reno Works" program, a focused, 8-week program to establish independence. We also met some of the "Outreach" guys, who provide 24 hour assistance and constantly walk around the facility.

Here are some involvement or volunteer opportunities, which could appeal to an individual, or could be organized as a Holy Cross group project:

- Volunteer at their Resource Center (Receive orientation from Kim, Linda's assistant. This would be more of an ongoing role.)
- Organize a sock, personal hygiene item, towel, bed sheet or other drive.
- Family Shelter: HCLC could host a birthday party for kids, an event the VOA coordinates every month. A group would plan games, play with kids, and serve snacks.
- Baby Shower: VOA coordinates this about 1 time per quarter for moms & babies.
- Move-Out Support: Program participants who are moving out into independent housing are typically provided with some household essentials. Linda told us about one donor/volunteer providing crock pots and recipes for clients.

## **Compassion Community Clinic**

**Compassion Community Clinic** is a faith-based nonprofit offering free dental care in the Reno-Sparks area since 2013. Dr. Paul Brosy, who has operated his own dental practice and is a member of Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, is their Dental Director. Kathy Secrist is their Executive Director. It is estimated that as many as 40,000 adults in greater Washoe County do not receive dental care because they lack dental insurance and cannot afford to pay

out of pocket. CC Clinic is the only ongoing free dental clinic in Northern Nevada and is located in Sparks.

*Clinic Operations:* CC Clinic is currently open one Friday and two Saturdays each month when its unpaid staff provides basic and necessary dental care, including exams with x-rays, cleanings, fillings, extractions, and oral health education. Those with additional needs are referred to appropriate organizations within the community or to dental specialists who've agreed to provide pro bono care for some of CC Clinic's patients. Patients and their families are also offered compassion and hope in Jesus Christ through prayer and information.

Support: CC Clinic is governed by a Board of Directors. CC Clinic services are financed through donations from individuals, churches, and businesses; grants; and other sources that align with the organization's mission. Volunteer opportunities: CC Clinic is looking for people who love to pray with and for others. Prayer Partners also help patients fill out paperwork and sometimes just lend a listening ear. The clinic offers a short training class and asks that a Prayer Partner commit to 4-5 hours every 3 months. They'd also appreciate referrals to dental professionals who might be curious about the CC Clinic.
