

Please join us for creative work, fun and fellowship. Thank you to all at Holy Cross for "Celebrating Generosity".




There is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex with specific tasks that will need to completed. We look forward to working together getting our "Home" ready for Easter Services.





Thrivent Generosity Programs

Thrivent Action Teams:

If you are a member of Thrivent you can apply to lead a volunteer team in a one-time fundraiser, service activity or educational event. Think about an unmet need at Holy Cross, bring a team together and make an immediate impact. Thrivent will help with resources to plan the event, provide promotional items, and give a Community Impact Card with \$250 of seed money.

Action team ideas include:

- host a basic budgeting class or teach a "how-to" class such as parenting, cooking, self defense, CPR


You can cry here....

Hymns and worship music stir up in us a whole host of emotion. Joy, thanksgiving, wonder, gratefulness, belonging, courage, and at times deep, deep sadness.

We sat, my friend and I, as worship moved through the paces. The children had come out from Godly play and two of the children came to sit with us. We greeted each other, giggled, and had some quiet conversation in the back row of the sanctuary about the story of today's Godly Play lesson as worship moved on.

Then came time for song. Oh my, the water works flowed. My friend was troubled by changes in her dad and what that would mean going forward, and I had recently lost my dad. And we had these two beautiful creations of God sitting with us. We had no tissue. I asked one of these children to go and get a box of tissue from the back table and hand it to my friend, I took some as well. I hugged my friend and said, "it's ok to cry here."

And these two beautiful young creations of God stayed with us, they didn't leave when we got teary. My friend and I cried together for a moment, and then as the song went on we noticed that a few other members were blotting eyes. And I heard one of these children say to the other very quietly, "its ok to cry here."





In Godly Play, we too have begun our Lenten journey getting ready for the Mystery of Easter. The stories that were told in March all were about helping the kids get ready. We heard lessons on Jesus & Jerusalem which went over the journeys of Jesus during Holy Week. We heard a lesson on Mary, Mother of Jesus.
