Devotions: By Pastor Kathy

We received the following reports: Financial Report— at May YTD revenue is \$111,939, above the same period in 2018 and net income is \$21,670 a decrease over March YTD as May reported a loss of \$2,755. Expenses remain tightly controlled. The Audit Committees 4/19 Audit Report was presented and accepted by the Council. Sue Volinkaty will follow up with Dawn to review the Audit committees' recommendations on computer backup. There was discussion of the current historical record process.

Pastor's Report—highlights: Sunday Prayer group has started, all are welcome, Summer Bible camp registration is underway, all are encouraged to take "Flat Jesus" with them on their summer travels. The Council discussed our outreach opportunity with the Boy Scouts, and the Boy Scout request that Holy Cross provide substantially more of the leadership component for the Cub Scout Pack than originally requested. To date no Holy Cross volunteers have indicated interest in this outreach/ leadership opportunity. While the Council expressed strong support of this community outreach, the now understood volunteer time commitment and to date lack of interest may make this opportunity difficult to support in the way requested by the Boy Scouts.



Pastor and Mark will continue to see if there are volunteers interested and also talk with the Boy Scouts about alternative ways that Holy Cross can support this Cub Scout pack program.

Council Liaison Reports: We received reports from: Worship and Music Sharon Voss & Dark Calise; Education and Learning Sue Volinkaty and Diane Torry; Outreach and Service; Sue Gonyou and Stephany Robison; Fellowship; Laurel Lindstrom and Richard Eggers; Administration and Support: Warren Kline.

Other Business: The Council evaluated the progress in accomplishing the goals and actions steps in the "Growing into Change" Goals and Council Actions Steps 2019. Progress is noted in all goal's areas: Expand Communication; Stewardship-Building up all that God has given us, Exploring and preparing for growth, and Special Projects. The July meeting will include discussion of God's Work our Hands Sunday, September 8 and the 2019 Stewardship program.

There are several projects underway (check out the Giving Tree—items for Eddy House) and "in development".


