

Our Council Meeting was held on July 22nd at 5:30 pm.

Devotions: By Fran Moses

We received the following reports:

*Financial Report*— at June YTD revenue is \$135,527, above budget and the same period in 2018 and net income is \$23, 177 above budgeted loss. Expenses remain tightly controlled, refrigerator repair and oiling of outside crosses were not budgeted and totaled \$1,100.

**Pastor's Report**— highlights: The summer Wednesday evening worship service experiences attendance of 8 to 22, the worship is meaningful for all who attend. Pastor thanked the lay leaders—Sheldon Flom, Sue Gonyou, Fran Moses and Pastor Grumm for leading Worship while she and her family were on vacation. 9 kids are attending Bible camp at Camp Zephyr the week of July 22-good intergenerational support of drivers and chaperones. We are looking for someone to chair or co -chair the Funeral/Memorial Reception Committee.

#### Council Liaison Reports:

We received reports from: Outreach and Service; Sue Gonyou and Stephany Robison; Fellowship; Laurel Lindstrom and Richard Eggers; Administration and Support: Warren Kline and Fran Moses. Cottage Meetings, Sue Volinkaty. Laurel presented the Committee Description and Procedures for the Memorial and Funeral Reception Ministry Committee

#### Other Business:

On-God's Work our Hands Sunday September 8 the Service committee leads us in preparing bags for Eddy's House, and an Ice Cream Social with music for our neighbors at Silver Sage will be held, Fran Moses committee chair. For our Fall Stewardship Program, the New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program has been selected. The Stewardship Committee is being formed, the Committee Chair has yet to be named. We will conduct our Time and Talent response in January- receiving the Time and Talent forms at our Annual Meeting. Warren reported on the new Ministry-Men's Saturday Breakfast group—5 attended in July! 2019 YTD Net Income is significantly above budget and expenses are 10% below budget. Income reflects increased congregation giving, a \$5,209 memorial gift to the general fund and reallocation of \$764 excess in Pastor moving fund. Expenses are tightly controlled. Unbudgeted expenses-refrigerator repair and oiling of exterior crosses \$1,100. Personnel expenses were underbudget primarily due to no Pastor salary & benefits the first two weeks of January.

## What a week to remember!

From July 22nd – 26th, 9 Holy Cross Youth attended Camp Zephyr at the Presbyterian Conference Center in Zephyr Point, Lake Tahoe. The week was active, engaging, social, relational and transformative. Following are some of the highlights:

We had 9 campers and 100% participation all week long! Each day campers met at HCLC at 7:30 am for group time, prayer, and departed for camp at 7:45 am. It took an hour to get there, and an hour to come home each day, with campers returning at 5:15 each evening and finishing with group time and prayer. For FIVE days straight, we had every camper there! Even with long days and long travel times at the beginning and end of each day, this group of 9 young church members experienced fellowship and camaraderie as they journeyed through the week together.

Here are two campers experiences in their own words....

"Camp was great! The first day, the new van broke down. We piled into personal vans. The could seat about 5 in each. We drove up the long way of an hour and five minutes. After arriving, we played until it was time to start the day. All the groups talk about different things during trail talk. After lunch we get into our swim clothes. The first two days are the days to pass the swim test. You have to swin from one dock to another. Then we tread water or float for 30 seconds. If you don't pass, you can only go in the water up to your waist. We get about an hour at the lake. Then you continue with your day until it's time to go." Zack Weldon

Abigail Morris' best memory was driving over the "Bridge of Death" every day. She also liked the tunnel where you held your breath and licked a finger at the same time.

This is just a small sampling of the fun our kiddos had at camp.




