Council News.....

Devotions: Warren Kline led us in Devotions: Psalm 89---Time is God's Gift to us—we receive 1440 minutes every day---use this gift wisely doing God's work with our hands.

Financial report: At September 30, 2019 YTD Net revenue is 13% above budget and net income is \$13,136 compared to a budgeted loss of \$(8,751). Net revenue is 24% higher than the same period in 2018. Expenses are at budgeted levels. 2020 budget cycle has begun, the interest rate on the second mortgage will reset November 1, 2019.

Pastor's Report: Highlights: A busy fall through Christmas season is "on the books". The September Pet Blessing was well received and attended. October 29 Trunk or Treat planning is underway—Jolene Jalliet and Kelley Meseberg are spearheading this new outreach event for young people and families. Signs ups for "Trunks" are going well, the congregation is encouraged to provide candy, invite family friend, post fliers-in general support this outreach activity. The Tuesday night lectionary Bible Study is taking a pause—due to busy schedules and Tuesday conflicts-with plans to "re-boot" after Christmas. Next Hot Topic program is scheduled for November 5 from 5-7 p.m. -topic suggestions are invited. Pastor is attending the Synod Professional Leaders Conference in October.

Committee/Ministry Reports:

Worship—Mark Calise presented request from Music to purchase folders for the Choir. Expense approved to be charged to the Memorial Fund.

Education & Learning—Godly Play has resumed, and AARP Safe Driver classes are underway. Outreach and Service---Service and Fellowship has selected the Giving Tree outreach/giving opportunities for Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Fellowship—Fellowship Committee has scheduled Oktoberfest, Advent Tree, Christmas "progressive dinner". Men's Monthly Saturday breakfast goes well.

Administration and Support- a new commercial vacuum has been purchased, The Live Nativity Committee is in "full swing"—November 9, the stable scene will be erected. Warren and Richard will contact pest contractor for ant problem.

Other Business: Council approved unbudgeted expense for November Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program. Kathy Doyle will chair the nominating committee. A special meeting with the Landscape Committee will be held November 13, 5 p.m. to review project proposal. Newcomer's Quilt Group monthly meeting was approved, \$150 per meeting once a month for 4 hours. Meeting was adjourned with Prayer.

Revenue and net income above budget.

- 1. Unrestricted general fund giving is up 25% from the same period last year. Net profit of \$13,136 this year compared to a loss of \$15,845 in 2018
- 2. Onetime gifts---\$5,000 in a memorial gift that was directed to the general fund And \$1,000 in Pastor's moving fund that was not spent –and directed to the general fund
- 3. Several members have elected to make their gifts annually in the first part of the year—rather than on a monthly or weekly basis. That means that approximately \$22,000 more has been received by September 30. \$12,000 of items 2 and 3 is considered nonrecurring. Adjusted for the items discussed in 2 and 3, unrestricted general fund giving is up 7% from same period last year.

Expenses remain tightly controlled at .002% above budget.

Repair of refrigerator and oiling of exterior crosses and resealing of parking lot were unbudgeted expenses of approximately \$4,100.

YTD Thank you receipts sent to all givers quarterly.

Future issues:

1. The second mortgage interest rate will re-set in November, we project an increase in interest expense. In 2020 the funds from the Capital Campaign for the second mortgage will have been spent, the payment will then come from the general operating budget.

2019 Council Members Wanted

Holy Cross will have three Church Council members whose first two-year term will be over at the end of this year. According to the Constitution they have the option of serving a second two-year term if they so desire. Our policy is to advertise these openings to our congregation members in case anyone wishes to offer their candidacy for one of these positions. 

Holy Cross Quilters....

Holy Cross Quilters completed and gave away 163 quilts during our "quilt year"! This brings total quilts given away over the last thirteen years to 1,705— (estimated retail value, \$76,725) The quilts were given to Lutheran World Relief, Veterans in Transition, Neo Natal Intensive Care unit at Renown Medical Center, Children in Transition in the Washoe County School District, Ronald McDonald House, Hosanna Home, Leah's Home, The Children's Cabinet and friends and members of Holy Cross.

We have helped people in disaster areas around the world, local homeless families and children, preemie hospitalized babies, veterans reestablishing themselves, children in need and congregation

members in need of support and comfort. People in our community and around the world have received a gift of love from Holy Cross, sending a quilt that provides shelter and warmth and a message that someone is thinking of them and cares for them "God's Work, our Hands."

Sandi and Paula delivered the Lutheran World Relief Quilts to the LWR In-Gathering at St. John's Lutheran in Vallejo—we are blessed to be a part of this LWR national effort. Trucks go around the country to pick up quilts from Lutheran Congregations, and then deliver the quilts to warehouses in St. Paul, MN and Baltimore, MD. LWR annually distributes over 400,000 quilts to people in need around the world. When a disaster or other need is identified, quilts are shipped from the warehouses (loaded into large shipping containers) to the area of need, and coordinating with local agencies "on the ground", given to our brothers and sisters in need. The LWR quilt ministry is a founding service and outreach program of LWR – started immediately after WWII to help war torn Europe.

Pastor Kathy joined in the fun to deliver the quilts locally. We delivered the quilts to seven local service agencies serving the Reno/Sparks area—helping our brothers and sisters, escape homelessness, addiction, giving comfort in times of medical need and crisis.

We are "back at work"! Meeting the first and third Thursday of each month; 9:30-12 noon and 1:00-3:00p.m. —we are working on our "Christmas Gift" to the Renown NICU unit---small quilts for premature babies in their intensive care unit. Look for the blessing of these quilts on December 8.

Please join us for fun creative work and fellowship—or just stop by to see what we are doing—together we follow "Christ's call to discipleship in the World".




Christmas Choir
