## Christ in Our Home


The July, August September devotional is available at the Garden Communion Services or at the church for pickup. If you are unable to pick one up , let the office know and we will get on to you.

If you need anything outside of those hours, please call Pastor Kathy at 702-423-0382.




#### July 1, 2020

## New Study and Discussion Groups starting in August <u>Church and Politics:</u>

As the debates in our country heat up over a wide variety of issues and as the elections get closer, there are many who are wondering, "What is the role of the church in times such as these?" And, "How does our faith impact the way we look at the world and the concerns of its people?" There are some who believe politics doesn't belong in the church, and there are others who are weary of the church being silent or quiet when the world is screaming.

In order to help us think through these kinds of issues, I am inviting you all to participate in a unique study and discussion group. Starting on Tuesday nights at 6:30pm in August, mostly likely on Zoom, we will be reading and discussing the ELCA's social statement *The Church in Society*. This document was put together and adopted by the 1991 Churchwide Assembly and it is the first in a series of ELCA social statements on a variety of issues. We will take our time as we read through and discover what the role of the church is in society. This is not designed for debates on specific social issues. Instead it is a time to work through the document and its Scripture references and discover if it is helpful for us when we look at what is happening in the world. This study group may take from 2-5 weeks as we work through it deliberately and carefully.

If you are interested in participating, please contact Pastor Kathy and plan to at least read through the document before we start discussion on August 4<sup>th</sup>.

### Faith Formation for Middle and High School Youth:

Last spring, we began discussions with families about developing an education program for our young people. We had actually made plans to start and then when everything happened, the plans got put on hold. However, it's time to pull them out and get ready because starting in August, we will be doing faith formation classes with anyone who is interested and in the middle school or high school age range. Some of us may remember confirmation classes, and while there will definitely be similarities to a traditional confirmation program, there will also be some additional pieces to equip our young people to grow as disciples of Jesus. We plan to meet two Sundays a month, timing to be determined, but likely early afternoon and our first meeting will be on Sunday, August 16, and it will be for both parents and youth.

I am putting together a registration form now, which should be available in the next week or so and emailed out to families with kids in this age-range. For those who complete the two year course, they will be invited to participate in the Affirmation of Baptism service (also known as Confirmation). If you have questions or would like to help lead or teach, please let me know! ~ Pastor Kathy
