### Next Steps for Our Visioning Process

As you may remember, last spring we began a new visioning process where we invited everyone to pray, specifically for Holy Cross and its ministries and its future. We will be continuing this process in September, and would like you to dream big and ask God to show you what He is putting on your mind and your heart for the future. It doesn't matter how simple or elaborate it might seem, we want to hear about it. Youth and young adults are especially encouraged to attend and add their input!

We will be hosting 6 Listening Sessions, which will be based around the following questions:

- What is God calling Holy Cross to do in the next 1-2 years?
- What is God calling Holy Cross to do in the next 3-5 years?
- What is God calling Holy Cross to do in the next 5-10 years?

In order to make sure we are hearing input from as many people as possible, we are setting up a variety of ways to participate.

- 1) Three sessions will take place on Zoom, and three will take place in person here at the church (six feet apart and wearing masks). Our goal is to have 10-15 people at each session, so you would only need to come to one of the sessions. If more than one member of your household is planning to come, please sign up each person.
- 2) We are asking you to make a reservation for whichever session fits best into your schedule.
- 3) If you are not comfortable with the technology or if you simply don't feel comfortable coming, you are welcome to email me your thoughts, but it is ideal to have people share with one another.

## A Message From Our Church Council

August 10 we met in a combined meeting — Zoom and in person in the Fellowship Hall (with masks and physically distanced). This was a first try, and it worked reasonably well.

Sue Gonyou led devotions—Chapter 2 of Power Surge-Discipleship for a Changing Church. "The question always is do our activities further discipleship and engage us in mission—in God's love for the world?"

We received reports from Finance and Administration and support, and Worship and Music.

Laurel Lindstrom presented the updated Building and Grounds Rental Documents. Policy, procedure, application, and agreement. With a few changes, the Building and Grounds Documents were approved, and the Council Executive committee was designated as the Committee to oversee the rental of our building to outside groups.

Most of the evening's business was discussed during Pastor's Report: When should we resume live worship in the building? There was agreement to continue outdoor Garden Worship through August and develop a plan for live worship in the building to be presented at the September 14 Council Meeting. We will be learning more as our schools open, and we continue to follow our local and state guidelines. We discussed using the Fellowship Hall for worship since it is a larger space, windows can be opened, and easier cleaning of chairs.

We discussed potential Caring Connections Ministry, Visioning for the future, Stewardship and plans for the fall and Christmas Seasons.

Upcoming events: Proverbs Bible Study, The Church in Society ELCA statement study, Confirmation classes, Blessing of the Backpacks, Blessing of the Animals, 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Sept. 20, and meetings on Silver Sage Thanksgiving Dinner and Live Nativity.

## LEAN Update

### NEVADA ADVOCATES RESPOND TO COVID-19 NEED

Lutheran Engagement and Advocacy in Nevada (LEAN) recently received a wonderful surprise gift. A very large donation came through the Sierra Pacific Synod from St. John's Lutheran Church of Sunnyvale, California (St. John's property had recently been sold as is the practice of the Synod, the proceeds of the sale are disbursed to support the ministries of the Synod).

This blessing arrived the first week of April, in the midst of the Covid-19 lockdown, and just as

the state unemployment offices were being overwhelmed with claims. LEAN was aware that food pantries throughout Nevada were likewise being overwhelmed. Although LEAN's mission is *advocacy* to address the root causes of hunger and poverty, the board recognized that a direct response to the emergency was appropriate, and also wanted to make a tithe in gratitude for the gift.

Northern Nevada is in the Sierra Pacific Synod, and Southern Nevada is in Grand Canyon Synod. LEAN's board decided to contribute to feeding programs in both Synods. A gift of \$5,000 went to Food Bank of Northern Nevada. The Food Bank is an industrial-scale operation that supplies food pantries throughout Northern Nevada, including Elko, Winnemucca, and other locations in what we refer to as "the rurals."



"The Food Bank is so grateful to partners like LEAN," said Nicole Lamboley, President and CEO of the Food Bank of Northern Nevada. "We are seeing significant increases in families who need our help during this crisis and we wouldn't be able to meet that need without partners who share our passion for helping our neighbors."

A similar gift was made to Lutheran Social Services of Southern Nevada, as well as an allocation to the Nye Communities Coalition. Both of these organizations serve Southern Nevada by providing resources and coordination.

LEAN is appreciative of the gift given and hopes to be able to continue to partner together with these agencies and others to benefit all in Nevada.

Due to Covid-19, many donation sites are at capacity. Please use the following if you are bringing donations to church:


