The longing in the hymn particularly reminds me of the longing that many of us are feeling in our hearts right now, and perhaps the prayers that we are saying as we wait with faith for the suffering of the world to end. Come Jesus, Come. Come and set us free from our fears. Come and set us free from our doubts and our sins. Come and let us find rest in you. Come and be our hope. Come and be the desire of hearts. Come and be the joy in our hearts. Come, thou long expected Jesus.

For the kids, it is the countdown to Jesus' birthday and a fun Christmas morning after an incredibly confusing year. Quilt Group News

On Sunday December 6 a special blessing will be part of our Worship Services. Fifty two small quilts, forty crocheted octopi and small hats will be blessed and then given to the Renown Neo Natal Intensive Care Unit.

Several years ago, the Quilt group was asked by Renown NICU to make small Christmas quilts for the babies that will be in the NICU over the Christmas Season. The Renown NICU performs life giving work with preemie babies for several weeks following their birth. This is a very difficult time for the parents and family, as they see their little ones hooked to tubes and machines— life giving but scary and institutional, with no touch of home. The Christmas quilts and hats keep the preemie babies warm, fitting over their tiny bodies in the isolates. The little quilts in a sterile, light-blinking, machine-whooshing world provide a sense of security and normalcy for the parents. The octopus are used to distract the babies from pulling on their multiple lifegiving tubes. The quilts, octopi and hats go home with the babies when they are discharged.

Making these quilts, octopi and hats is a special time for Holy Cross Quilters and knitters. When we were first asked, we didn't know if we could complete the project –but we agreed to try. Now each year we look forward to starting our "quilt year" by making these special gifts for babies and families in our community—as we design, cut, iron and sew and crochet we are blessed to be able to work together to bring comfort and joy to babies and families –a visible way of sharing Christ's love during the Christmas Season as we celebrate Christ's birth.

Hooks & Needles

We are back "at it" — safe distancing and wearing our masks. We welcome all knitters and crocheters and/ or those who want to learn how to knit or crochet.

We are a small group and make afghans/lap robes, scarves, hats, and shawls for local causes here in the Reno/Sparks area as well as for our family and friends.

A Message From Our Church Council

Your Council met on November 9—in person and via Zoom. Sue Gonyou led us in our opening devotions/study of Power Surge, our discussion revolved around the Marks of Discipleship: Daily Prayer, Weekly Worship, Bible Reading, Service, Spiritual Friendships, Giving.

We received reports:

From Pastor---updates on Stewardship, Thanksgiving, Christmas worship and activities and outreach—church together continues in new and different ways! Thanks be to God!

From the Finance Committee---While October giving was improved over September, expenses exceed revenue resulting in a loss of \$6,942, bringing the YTD loss to \$3,531. The finance committee has projected a loss of \$10,000 at year end. Revenue losses are primarily a result of reduced rent, cash plate and new member giving. Expenses remain well controlled. We have not used our PPP loan/grant, but will use to cover operating shortfalls as necessary. On November 13, we applied for loan/grant forgiveness of the PPP loan from Umpqua Bank/SBA.

Laurel presented and council approved the Leave Policy. The nominating committee is being formed to identify candidates to fill the open positions on the Church Council, to be presented at the January annual meeting.

We reviewed our Pandemic response plan and discussed the increasing COVID-19 cases in Washoe County, deciding to continue to closely monitor for changes and possible impact on Holy Cross.

On November 12 the Council met via Zoom to discuss the worsening of the COVID-19 pandemic health crisis and the Governor's request that citizens over the coming two weeks stay at home as much as possible to "flatten the curve." Churches were not asked to close in person worship. However, the Council decided that continuing virtual Worship and closing in person Worship beginning Sunday November 22 was the best decision and in keeping with our desire to work together to keep our congregation, staff and our community safe. We will continue to monitor the pandemic health crisis closely.
