From Pastor Kathy:

Dear Friends,

Last week there was a little drama in the Morris Family. We got word on Tuesday that Samuel's pre-school teacher tested positive for Covid-19. Our first concern was for her health, but then we quickly realized that we had all been exposed; Sam most directly, but all four of us had been to school and talked with the teacher while she had not been feeling well. We decided in an abundance of caution to put ourselves on a bit of a lock-down. Samuel's school was closed for two weeks, I worked from home, Abigail started distance learning, and we went and got our COVID-19 tests. We tested negative.

I was relieved to say the least, but my relief stems mostly from knowing that I had interacted with many of you over the previous weekend, and the worry that I had inadvertently passed something onto you all. I also wondered what would happen to our plans to come inside if I or one of my family members got sick. (continued on pg. 2)

I know I've said all of this already, but I believe it's worth repeating: if it is not safe for you to be in a crowd, if you are high at risk, if you don't feel well, or have a fever above 100.4, please don't come. Our service will continue to be available to view online on Sunday mornings on Facebook & Youtube.

Making Reservations for Indoor Worship

- Please Note: If you sign up for Sunday worship after 3pm on Thursdays, you <u>MUST</u> contact Pastor Kathy via email, text or phone (702-423-0382), or use Sign Up Genius. The church office is officially closed on Fridays and Saturdays so if you leave a message, it may not be picked up.

If we notice that one service is becoming "too full" we may ask people to change which service they want to attend. And if we notice that both services are becoming "too full" we very well may add a third service.

You will note that right now our reservations take us through December. We will see as we get closer to that time if we need to continue the reservation system, at which time we will add more dates.

Ten Things to Know About Returning to Worship


- 1. Worship is at 8am and 10:30 in the Fellowship Hall. Godly Play for kids will be available during the 10:30 service. "Live Worship" will likely be shorter than what you are used to, and we are asking everyone to make a reservation to attend.
- 2. Singing and speaking in unison (all together) are considered super-spreaders of the virus, so we will not be singing, and will be limiting things we say in unison.
- 3. You will be asked to pick up your communion elements as you come into the worship space. Please hold onto them throughout worship.
- 4. Everyone **MUST** wear a mask, and Pastor Kathy will likely be wearing a face shield while leading worship.
- 5. The offering plate will be on a table as you walk in, or on the altar as you leave worship. We will not be passing the plate.
- 6. In order to maintain the quality of our online worship service, we will continue to prerecord that service and have it available for viewing on Sunday mornings (this is different than what you may have heard). We may from time to time record special events happening at our "live" service, and will post them online later in the week.
- 7. Bulletins will get emailed out on Thursdays, and there will be two bulletins contained in the email. One will be for the online service and the other will be for the "live" service. They will be different. At our "live" Sunday morning service, we are going to try to worship without a bulletin. We will be using a screen, but if you want to follow along with the service, you can download it on a phone or a tablet, or you can print it at home and bring it with you.
- 8. When we have live instrumental music, our musicians may choose to stay in their own music "bubble" as they work to stay healthy.
- 9. We are asking everyone to maintain 6 feet of distance between those outside of their own household, or those in their "bubble" and others, and chairs will be set up to reflect that.
- 10. Please stay home if you don't feel well, are at high-risk, have a temperature above 100.4, or have tested positive for Covid-19. (If you do test positive and have been in the building, please let us know as soon as possible. We will welcome you back when you test negative again.)

We really appreciate everyone's flexibility and patience as we transition back inside! If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Pastor Kathy.

So, what's next? We now begin to work on small Christmas quilts to give to the Renown Hospital Neo Natal Intensive Care Unit for the preemie babies in the NICU unit over the Christmas season. These quilts wrap the babies in the NICU unit and then each preemie baby in the unit is given a quilt when they go home. We will bless these quilts the first Sunday in December.

Come join us! Our regular meeting times are the first and third Thursday of each month 9:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.—though most Thursdays you can find a few quilters working in the Fellowship Hall.

A Message From Our Church Council

The Council met via Zoom on September 14th. Sue Gonyou led us in our devotional study of Power Surge— Chapter 3 "the Marks of Discipleship"—we discussed how Holy Cross might change if we all respond as Christ's Disciples, and how visitors to Holy Cross would view us differently if we moved to a discipleship model.

Pastor presented the plan for resuming indoor worship, following the COVID-19 pandemic requirements. Following a thorough discussion of the issues and opportunities surrounding resuming indoor worship, the plan was approved. Our target date for resuming indoor Worship is October 4th. We will resume worship in the Fellowship Hall. The Fellowship Hall is a larger space than the Sanctuary, and with the movable wall open, it has better air circulation with windows and doors, the chairs are easier to clean, and more people can attend a worship service with the pandemic restrictions.

To accommodate Worship Services in the Fellowship Hall, the Council approved the recommendation from the Building and Grounds Committee that we enhance the audio-visual capability in the Fellowship Hall. This is also an investment in future Holy Cross ministry, making the Fellowship Hall better equipped for events such as Seder, Advent Tea, and other gatherings. The cost is \$5,000 and the funds are available outside of the general operating fund in the Building and Grounds Fund and the Memorial Fund. If members and friends wish to contribute to this building enhancement, those gifts would be welcome. The Building and Grounds Team is leading the installation of the enhanced audio visual in the Fellowship Hall.

Godly Play Sunday School will resume in the Sanctuary. The Godly Play classroom is not large enough to safely accommodate the children with the required pandemic restrictions. The Sanctuary will safely accommodate the children and teachers. In this way, we keep our children safe and put our children first.

Pastor will send a letter to the congregation with the plans and target dates. The Council will monthly continue to closely monitor our community pandemic situation and trends to determine when we can safely resume worship in the Sanctuary and Godly Play in their usually designated space.

We celebrated Holy Cross's 40th Birthday on September 20 in our Garden Worship with the dedication of the Memorial Garden, and in Virtual worship, including a special greeting from Synod Bishop Mark Homelrud. The additional celebratory plans—concert, reception, cookbook, documentary have been postponed to "post-pandemic time" in 2021.

We received additional reports from Pastor—Confirmation class continues, and plans are developing for the coming months, including Halloween, Silver Sage to-go Thanksgiving dinner, Advent Tea, Live Nativity in different format, Christmas Services, etc.

Sue Gonyou reported on the plans from Service and Fellowship, Warren Kline reported on Building and Grounds, and we received a report from the Finance Committee.

Richard Eggers led us in closing prayer at 7:30.
