New Bible Study Begins

As many of you know, we have been talking about starting a Bible study/ discussion group centered around understanding and welcoming those with more diverse backgrounds than many of us have experienced.

After much prayer, thought and planning, that Bible Study called, "Created in God's Image: An Exploration of the Gift of Diversity in Scripture" will begin on Monday, August 23. Pastor Kathy will be leading and creating the Bible study using a wide variety of resources as background and teaching aids. We anticipate that the course of study will take us to the end of October and it will touch on important social concerns like race, immigration, sexuality, economics, and more.

Because of the importance of the subject, we will be having two meeting times. One will be at the church at 11am, and the other will be at 6:30 in the evening. She will let you know how we will meet for that session, the week before.



A Message From Our Church Council

Our July meeting opened with a devotional story illustrating how our perceptions can be clouded and can contribute to judging others, rather than looking at ourselves. If we look for good, we are more likely to find good. We then appointed Sandi Christman to council. Chris Martin and Fran Moses have resigned from council. Your council representatives are: Pastor Kathy, Veralyn Combs (VP), Warren Kline (Secretary), Laura Grady, Sandi Christman, Diane Torry, and myself (Pres.) If you are interested in serving on council, please let Pastor or myself know. We also voted to change council meeting night to the 2nd Tuesday starting at 5:15 pm.

If you are interested in helping to share the good news of Jesus Christ with our congregation and visitors on Sunday morning, call the office and sign up for: lector, usher, communion assistant, acolyte, and/or choir/special music. There is also an opportunity to restart the Book Club. What a great way to discuss our faith and beliefs using the reading and discussion of a good, "chewy" book. If that sounds like fun - give me a call!

The Information Security Policy was approved. We are able to use a credit/debit card device to take payments for things like Seder dinner or raffle tickets if that is easier for you. We also approved a Photo and Video disclaimer policy. This policy outlines how Holy Cross uses photos/videos on our website, social media, pamphlets etc. to tell our story, provide visitors information and an idea of what to expect when they attend our worship services and events, highlight the work of those who serve, and allow us to communicate our mission as a church for people who don't go to church via our website and other digital and print media. If you see a photo on a Holy Cross's website or social media page that includes you or your child and would prefer it be removed, please contact the church office. These policies are available in the Policy Manual in the church office or they can be emailed to you.

Council is talking about a way to provide a family bathroom. It would be ideal to add another bathroom, but that is not feasible at this time. Having the ability to lock the bathrooms would be more friendly for families, handicapped who may require a caregiver to help, and/or others that need more privacy. I also have noticed that some of our members struggle to get in and out of the car as the handicapped parking spaces are a bit narrow. We would like to create van accessible spot(s) and add additional designated handicap spots. If you have any ideas or concerns, let a council member know.

Disbursement of the budgeted quarterly Synod Benevolence was approved. The meeting ended with prayer.
