In September we "wrapped up our "Quilt Year". On God's Work our Hands Sunday, September 12 we blessed our quilts, afghans, hats, and scarves – the Sanctuary was a rainbow of color and art.

We distributed our quilts, crocheted and knitted items, locally to Veterans in Transition--for Veterans getting established in their own homes, Washoe County School District, Children in Transition--helping homeless students in our School District; Ronald McDonald House--supporting families of children who are hospitalized; Hosana Home -helping women regain their lives; and the Children's Cabinet--helping children in our community, victims of the Dixie Fire, Bear Hugs, who support victims of wild fires, floods and hurricanes throughout the country, Women's Children Center of the Sierra, helping women and children move from poverty to self-sufficiency and through Lutheran World Relief, we send our quilts to our brothers and sisters in need around the world. We also are blessed to provide a comforting quilt to congregation members, friends and neighbors in need of support and comfort.

Thank you to everyone who participates and supports the Quilt Group's outreach ministry of Holy Cross.

We dedicate our quilts and knitted and crocheted items to Christ's service, trusting that Christ's love will go wherever each item is sent, making it more than just a piece of material, yarn or a collection of items—making each quilt and afghan we have created an expression of love.

During October and November, we will be working on 24-inch small quilts that we will give to the Renown Neo Natal Intensive Care Units for babies who are in the NICU units over the Holiday season.
