## News from the Holy Cross Quilters

On Sunday, December 5, a special blessing will be part of our Worship Services. Fifty small quilts and fifty crocheted octopus will be blessed and then given to the Renown Neo Natal Intensive Care Unit.

Several years ago, the Quilt group was asked by Renown NICU to make small Christmas quilts for the babies that will be in the NICU over the Christmas Season. The Renown NICU performs life giving work with preemie babies for several weeks following their birth. This is a very difficult time for the parents and family, as they see their little ones hooked to tubes and machines- life giving but scary and institutional, with no touch of home. The Christmas guilts keep the preemie babies warm, fitting over their tiny bodies in the isolates. The little guilts in a sterile, light-blinking, machine-whooshing world provide a sense of security and normalcy for the parents. The octopus are used to distract the babies from pulling on their multiple lifegiving tubes. The quilts and octopus go home with the babies when they are discharged.


Making these quilts and octopus is a special time for Holy Cross Quilters and knitters. When we were first asked, we didn't know if we could complete the project but we agreed to try. Now each year we look forward to starting our "quilt year" by making these special gifts for babies and families in our community—as we design, cut, iron and sew and crochet we are blessed to be able to work together to bring comfort and joy to babies and families—a visible way of sharing Christ's love during the Christmas Season as we celebrate Christ's birth.

September giving was \$12,316, (\$872 less than previous year) producing a Sept. net loss of \$6,609. This reflects slower giving in summer months, and member loss. Budget to Actual reports general fund giving slightly above budget, and expense to budget 2% over budget. PPP Grant has not been used to date.

October council meeting started with a devotion "Why be a Lutheran?". Because Lutherans are clear in their belief that God loves us as we are. We are saved by grace. God comes down to meet us in our broken world and broken state...thankfully, for none of us could do anything worthy enough to go up to God.

We are looking forward to a meeting with Pastor Marta Poling Schmidt to discuss evangelism strategies. A faith based knitting group called "Close Knit Friends" is coming to use our space in November. We are excited to have this ministry restarting at Holy Cross and if you love to knit - this is the group for you! They plan on meeting the 2nd and 4th Mondays at 1pm (except in December). The Stewardship team has met, look for video clips on Facebook/TikTok/Instagram. We will be sending out several letters and I encourage you to prayerfully consider how we can not only continue but further our reach into the community and the world. Our Stewardship campaign was a great success! If you haven't had a chance to provide us with your "estimate of giving card" and wish to do so you may turn it in to the church office. We would like to thank those of you who graciously pledged to help us continue our mission.

As I've mentioned before, we have an option to purchase 10% of silver sage, affordable senior housing, located here with us for \$1. We found out that we have until March of 2023 before we need to decide. A small team has been looking at the pros and cons of this offer. The team will make a recommendation to the council, council will make a recommendation, and then the congregation will vote on this option. The pros and cons will be presented for information and discussion at the January 2022 annual meeting.
