Dear Friends,

As we enter into the month of March, we are also entering into the church season of Lent. Celebrating Lent has been a long-standing tradition of Christians throughout the world.

As the season leads up to the celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter, we find ourselves given the opportunity to focus on what that Christ's sacrifice means for us, and perhaps what that gift of life means to us.

It is common for people to take on Spiritual disciplines or faith practices during the season of Lent as an opportunity to reflect upon their life and their faith. Traditionally these disciplines are based in prayer, fasting and giving. In prayer, we strive to strengthen or renew our connection to God as we share with God the things that are happening lives, encompassing our thanksgivings, our concerns, our burdens and our joys and anything else that we would want to share with our loving Creator. The concept of fasting or "giving something up" for Lent is rooted in the idea that when you find yourself longing for the thing that you gave up, you turn to God for strength. Giving is another way we can share the abundance of our gifts with God and God's people. These disciplines are all designed to help us strengthen the relationship we each have with God.

This year at Holy Cross, I invite you to join us n deepening our faith as we participate in some of these faith practices. In this newsletter, you will find multiple opportunities to participate in a variety of events and we hope you will join us as you are able. Also available at the church is a devotional calendar put together by ELCA World Hunger.

We begin our Lenten journey with Ash Wednesday Services will be offered on Wednesday, March 2 at noon and at 6:30pm. Each service will serve communion and offer the imposition of ashes. We hope you join us!






Seder Meal




We are grateful to support this local nonprofit group doing life giving work in our local community.


