From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

I wanted to thank you all for the time away last month as I traveled to Denver for the annual Festival of Homiletics for some Continuing Education. I especially want to thank my husband Jeff, for holding down the fort at home, so I could have some time for renewal and learning. Our theme for the week was After the Storm: Preaching and Trauma, which was appropriate considering what the world has been through over these last two years. We heard lectures and sermons which both challenged us and inspired us.

In the coming months, you may hear snippets of things that I picked up, but one of the things that I want to share with you was from a lecture that was done by the Rev. Dr. Joy J. Moore, who is a professor of Biblical preaching at Luther Seminary. One of the things that she reminded us of, and which I have taken to heart more than once in the time since I've returned from Colorado, is that while we may be shocked and appalled by the news that we read about, hear about, or watch on our televisions, God is not. God is not shocked by our news. God has seen the sorrows before. God has seen political arguments. God has seen the mistreatment of people. God has seen the murder of children. God has seen the economic struggles of life. God has seen it all before.

But as Dr. Moore said, "We have hope because of God's faithfulness in the past." Many of us have been through difficult and even tragic times, and God has shown us God's presence and faithfulness in those
