

COUNCIL NEWS

September Council meeting opened with devotion on sharing our faith with other. Financially we came out of with strong giving. the summer Expenses continue to controlled. The PPP loan has not been used as of yet this year. The current estimated net loss as of August 31 is \$4027. The copier was replaced and we will see a savings of \$2400/year from our previous lease. The garage sale was a huge success and our upcoming outreach events include pet blessing, Oktoberfest, Christmas sales, and shoot, Stewardship will kick off the first Sunday of October. Please plan on attending one of the small group meetings - we want to hear about your hopes and dreams for Holy Cross. We are looking at starting a Care of Creation Committee. The intent would be to look at how we can be more ecologically minded, such as looking in to solar panels, composting, energy efficiency measures etc. We continue to discuss the Silver Sage option with the plan of bringing the congregation a recommendation for vote at the January annual meeting.



In September we "wrapped up our "Quilt Year". On Sunday, September 24 we blessed our quilts, the Sanctuary was a rainbow of color, art, and caring. This year Holy Cross Quilters are giving away more than 225 quilts.

We distribute our quilts, locally to Veterans in Transition--for Veterans getting established in their own homes, Washoe County School District, Children in Transition—helping homeless students in our School District; Ronald McDonald House—supporting families of children who are hospitalized; Hosana Home -helping women regain their lives; and the Children's Cabinet helping children in our community, Women's Children Center of the Sierra, helping women and children move from poverty to self-sufficiency, this year we will give to the Empowerment Center and through Lutheran World Relief, we send our quilts to our brothers and sisters in need around the world. We also are blessed to provide a comforting quilt to congregation members, friends and neighbors in need of support and comfort. Thank you to everyone who participates and supports the Quilt Group's outreach ministry of Holy Cross.

We dedicate our quilts to Christ's service, trusting that Christ's love will go wherever each quilt is sent, making it more than just a piece of material, making each quilt we have created an expression of love.

During October and November, we will be working on 24-inch small quilts that we will give to the Renown Neo Natal Intensive Care Units for babies who are in the NICU units over the Holiday season.
