## From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

It was only a couple of days after Christmas that I walked into a store and saw the display of chocolate and items for sale for Valentine's Day. I was not prepared for that. I remember my many years as a single person and really dreading all of the fuss and messaging that came around Valentine's Day. It was difficult and created a loneliness that I still remember.

When Jeff and I started celebrating Valentine's Day together, even then, it was never typical. It was always tax season, and for me, I was often either in the season of Lent, or I was getting ready for it. We usually celebrated Valentine's Day not on the actual day because of our schedules.

I guess what I'm trying to express is that while I appreciate the gift of Valentine's Day as a day to remember the love in our lives, it really is just a day. We really should be remembering and celebrating the love in our lives every day. I say that knowing that there are many among us, who grieve the loss of love or the loss of a loved one and struggle to remember that they are loved. I recognize that.

But I want to remind you all that no matter what your feelings might be, you are deeply loved by the God who has created you and called you a beloved child through the waters of your baptism. You are not alone. Christ is with you, and you are loved.

When I feel down about something or I'm feeling lonely, one of my favorite things to do is to reach out to someone else – to find a way to connect because then not only do I find that my spirits lift, but perhaps theirs might as well. I invite us all in this season of love and Valentine's Day to find ways to show love to the people in our lives, to the people who are in our church, to the people who live far away from us and even to strangers. Love is a beautiful gift and it is a gift meant to be shared.

I also want to let you know that we are starting a Grief Support Group for those who are experiencing the loss of a loved one. We will meet once a month and our time together will consist of a devotional reading but will also mostly be a time to talk and share about how we are doing. Our first meeting will be on Tuesday, February 28 at 4:30pm. My hope is that those who are working may be able to join with those who may also be retired, but at our first gathering, we will also talk about the timing of our meetings. Everyone is welcome and if you have friends or loved ones who have experienced loss, I encourage you to invite them as well. Please let me know if you have any questions or thoughts.

## SUPPORTING AGING SENIORS: SENIOR TRANSITIONS PROGRAM

This three-week program is offered on February 4,11,25, Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 12 noon in the Fellowship Hall at Holy Cross.

Supporting Aging Seniors is designed for Seniors, their families, and support networks, to learn about and explore options for safe senior independent living and alternatives when living totally on their own is no longer safe or desirable for the senior.

It is human nature to put off or even ignore life's difficult decisions. The challenges of aging may intimidate us and conversations between parents and adult children or seniors and loved ones are avoided. In the worst-case scenario, no discussion has taken place and no plans are made until a crisis hits.

### Program Overview

**Session 1: Beginning the conversation: signs that you need help, changing relationship, values: what matters to you, critical conversations with loved ones.**

**Session 2: Living arrangements: Staying at Home, Safety, Care; Alternative Living Options/Senior Communities; Downsizing; Resources.**

**Session 3: Planning for the future: Financial Concerns & Planning; Legal issues related to aging: wills, trusts, power of attorney, medical directives and POLST.**

Attend individually or with your adult children, or support network. Invite your friends to join us.

# CHURCH COUNCIL

We opened our January meeting with a devotion about worry and how we are to “seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you”. We worried at the beginning of the year that we may not be able to financially make it. But we ended the year strong with a \$3000 loss, much less than the originally projected loss of \$29,975. This past year we planned many outreach events to engage with the community and share our love of Christ. We stepped forward in faith and we had a wonderful year. This reflects the strong giving of members and friends, and free-will giving from various outreach events we hosted. Thank you! We are planning to continue a number of these events in 2023. We still have our \$36,700 PPP money in savings, and we are also putting the 3-year blessing pledge money into our savings account. If you are giving money for the building of the reserve, please label it as such so we can set it aside.

The proposed spending plan was presented to the council, and we accepted the plan for presentation at the annual meeting on February 5th. Please plan on attending. We will have one worship service at 9 am and the meeting immediately after. We have a need for flower and coffee hour sign-ups. Council decided to raise the flower price to \$30 in order to help cover the cost. I presented the current plan for High Desert Harmony riser management. The chorus will take at least 2 risers off-site; the remaining 4 risers will remain in the back of the choir room; HDH will look at options to hide the risers, such as a room divider. The Pastor requested the HDH move the risers off-site for events that require the use of all the choir room space, e.g. vacation Bible School. HDH and HCLC strive for open communication to solve any issues that may come up with riser storage. If you have concerns about the risers, please let me know.

Katie Torry and I have been meeting with small groups of the church to discuss a draft welcome statement for Holy Cross. We look forward to getting input, having discussions, and presenting a statement for the congregation to discuss and finalize soon. Please reach out to us if you have input or questions. The new council will be meeting a week early on February 7th due to Valentine’s Day. Again, I want to thank all the council members for their hard work and support over the past 2 years.
