

## From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

Recently, we had these words as part of our Scripture readings:

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." (Acts 2:42)

In this verse, we have a picture of what was most important to those members of the early church – the Word, fellowship, communion, and prayer. From this verse, we have what are core practices for churches across the world. In our worship services, we have time for learning from the word, we share in the Lord's Supper each week. We have numerous prayers that we say throughout our service. And here at Holy Cross, we joke about how long it takes to pass the peace because people want to be sure to greet everyone, and this is the key to fellowship.

This congregation has always enjoyed coming together in fellowship as we worship, as we participate in meals, as we study Scripture, as we serve one another and the community through the ministry we provide. I know it's been a tradition to go to one worship service so we can all be together in the summer months, and I know last year, I messed with that and had us stay at two, which I think was okay for where we were and what we were doing last summer.

However, this summer, it feels like we are really missing the opportunity to worship all together as one congregation. So, we are going back to having one service only in the summer! <u>Starting on May 21, we will move to a summer schedule where the church will begin each Sunday at 9:30 am.</u> Why 9:30? We've never had church at 9:30 before! The reason for the time is to try to accommodate some folks who really like the service starting later in the morning. We hope that 9:30 will provide a little bit of a cushion to those who have a hard time getting up and moving in time for a 9 am service, while also respecting that some people like to have their day start early so they can enjoy the remainder of the day.

# Supporting Aging Seniors: A Senior Transitions Program Hospice Care and Memorial & Funeral Planning

This one-day program is offered Tuesday, June 20, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon in the Fellowship Hall at Holy Cross. Supporting Aging Seniors is designed for Seniors, their families, and support networks, to learn about and explore issues Seniors experience as we age.

During this session we will learn about the services provided by Hospice Care, as we move into the final time of our lives, and how to plan for Memorial or Funeral Services. We will have a speaker from a Hospice company and our own Pastor Kathy will discuss Memorial and Funeral Planning.

It is human nature to put off or even ignore life's difficult times and decisions. The challenges of aging may intimidate us and conversations between parents and adult children or seniors and loved ones are avoided. In the worst-case scenario, no discussion has taken place and no plans are made until a crisis hits. Our Senior Transition Programs provide a safe, comfortable place and time to learn about and discuss issues of aging.
