

From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends.

Many years ago, I found myself at an isolated place called Holden Village in Washington State as a chaperone on a youth retreat. Aside from a pretty epic water fight, what I remember from that weekend was the theme. "Practicing the Presence" was the theme and I think there may have even been a song to go with it. And all of the activities of the weekend were opportunities for the participants in the retreat to learn and be reminded that because Christ is always with us, wherever we went or wherever we would go, we took the presence of Jesus with us.

I've always tried to remember that as I've done ministry. When I go and make a visit in the hospital, when I comfort a family who is mourning, when I perform a wedding, when I hang out with youth group kids, when I chat with people, when I lead worship, I try to be an open vessel to bring the presence of Jesus to people and to a place. It's not just my calling to do that as a pastor, but I know it is the work of the whole church. We gather on Sunday mornings to be filled and fed with the presence of Christ and then we are sent out to take the light and the presence of Christ into the world.

This last month, we had numerous opportunities to share the presence of Christ with our community. We hosted an Art Town Quilt Show and Concert. We had a booth and a presence at the Reno Pride Festival. We welcomed friends from Silver Sage and the congregation to an ice cream social. Young people played at Lake Tahoe and at a local mini-golf course. Christ was with us.

Evangelism can be a terrifying word. The thought of it makes some of us quake in our boots; however, when you break it down and remember that evangelism is really about carrying the presence of Christ with us everywhere we go, it doesn't have to be that complicated. Being present means we're in the moment, paying attention and being open to the needs around us – Whether it's the needs that Jesus has for us, or if it is the needs the community has. As we reflect on the ministries that we've been doing lately and look forward to more things to come, let us remember that all we do is to bring the presence of Christ – his love, his forgiveness, his hope, his healing and his peace – to all the places we go and all the fun we have!


