Pride Parade

We've recently gotten the question: Why are we participating in the Reno Pride Festival?

We wanted to share with you our reply:

A suggestion came to the church council that we participate in the Reno Pride Festival on Saturday, July 22.

Council discussed and realized it would be a good opportunity to reach out to our LGBTQIA+ community with the love and grace of Christ our Lord.

As you know, the church has been talking about the creation of a welcome statement for the past several months. Council thought that having a booth at the Pride Festival is in alignment with our mission to welcome all and our proposed welcome statement.

Our booth will be at Wingfield Park on 1st St. on Saturday, July 22. If you would like to be part of the welcoming team at the booth, please contact Katie Torry.

Holy Cross Lutheran Church Draft Declaration of Welcome and Affirmation:

We affirm that each person is a beloved and unique creation made in the image of God. We give thanks to God for the diversity of race, culture, ethnicities, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, physical and neuro diversity, socioeconomic status, family structure, background, and faith journey. We see all people as God's precious children and accept and celebrate all differences and gifts. We are committed to the work of loving one another, being intentionally welcoming, and inviting all home into this faith community. Following Christ's example, we strive for racial justice, avoid hurtful speech, actions, behaviors and love one another as God loves us. Here at Holy Cross, there is a place for you!

FAQ's:

- 1. Why do we need to have a welcome statement?
 - a. We want to be clear about who we are and what we believe at Holy Cross.
- 2. Why do we need to list all the diversity examples when we already say we welcome all?
 - a. Some people have been excluded, hurt, judged, scorned, ridiculed, guilted, expected to change, and/or ostracized for who they are by others with differing beliefs. We want our visitors and members to know that this is a safe place, and we strive to love others as Christ loves us.
- 3. What if we leave out a category of diversity with our listing?
 - a. We have tried to be as inclusive as possible but if we have missed something we hope you will tell us! This statement can be changed as needed, just like our mission and vision statements. Our statements are reviewed on a regular basis by our Church Council. Your input is always welcome and very important.
- 4. What does it mean if we affirm this statement?
 - a. By affirming this statement, we are agreeing that we believe each person is made in the image of God and we accept them and love them as God loves us. We are willing to work at loving others and welcoming them into our family. We want to be caring in our words and actions and be open to conversations about differences in order to better understand one another.
- 5. How are we "striving for racial justice"?
 - a. We look for ways to serve the needs of our community despite any racial or ethnic differences. We also support a number of local and global organizations that serve various ethnic groups. We recognize there are always opportunities to grow.

At this point we feel we are ready to present the congregation with this welcome statement at the mid-year annual meeting for affirmation. We have met with a number of you in small groups, disseminated information in the newsletter, held a hot topic meeting, encouraged your input and questions, created educational posters. We feel there is agreement with and acceptance of the statement as a reflection of who we are at Holy Cross. Please contact us or Pastor Kathy if you have any questions or concerns.


