Dear Friends,

June is looking to be an exciting time at Holy Cross as we once again host our Camp Kairos – Vacation Bible School from June 26-June 30. The mornings (From 9am-noon) will be bustling with activity as we welcome kids who are pre-school age through 5th grade to come and join us “At the Farm” this year. You’ll start to see some new decorations going up in the next couple of weeks to help us get ready.

Each day the kids will have a Bible story that helps them to discover more about growing in their faith as we have Bible stories, crafts, science experiments, games, snacks and more. Time with the kids as they discover new things and grow is always a sacred and holy time, and we treasure it each year.

If you are interested in helping, there are some ways that we could use your help!

- 1) If you know any children who would like to come, please invite them! We have some flyers available that you can take and share with them!
- 2) There are items on the Giving Tree that we will be using for VBS, and if you would like to sign up and bring something, it would be greatly appreciated. While we do take an offering during the week, we do not charge families for VBS. If you would rather not shop, but want to make a donation to off-set the cost, that is also appreciated.
- 3) We are still looking for volunteers to help during the week and if you would like to come and help, there is plenty that you can do. Currently, our biggest need is for people who would be willing to lead small groups of kids around from activity to activity!
- 4) If you have farm experience and would like to come and share with the kids about what you remember about life on the farm, it would be fun for our “city kids” to hear your stories. Let me know if you would be interested.

- 5) We are going to be starting our decorating on Friday, June 16, and if you would like to come and help, we would love for you to! We expect we will be doing more decorating throughout that weekend, so please be in touch if you would like to help.
- 6) If you are planning to volunteer, we will be having two volunteer meetings and we would ask that you attend one of them as we will be going over the week as well as our Child Protection Policy. One meeting will be after church on Sunday, June 11 and the other will be Thursday, June 15 at 6pm in the evening. You can choose which meeting will work best for your schedule and come to that one.
- 7) Please keep our VBS ministry in your prayers. Pray for the children who are coming (many of whom are not from our congregation), pray for our volunteers, pray for the Holy Spirit to be at work!

I appreciate all of your support for this important ministry. It is such a blessing that we welcome children and help them create wonderful foundations and memories of faith and church.

Close Knit Friends News

The past few months, **Close Knit Friends** faced a multitude of requests for items of warmth and comfort from several local organizations. The cold and snowy winter months lasted longer than usual this year so more hats, scarves, socks, mittens, blankets, shawls, and coats were needed. **Close Knit Friends** asked the congregation and the quilters if they could help us meet some of these requests. The response was extraordinary! Over **1,000** handmade and donated items were collected and delivered between January and April to the *Women and Children's Center of the Sierra, Marvel Way Complex, Ronald McDonald House, Women Veterans Program, and Catholic Charities*. Thank you, Holy Cross! You are a generous and supportive partner to us and the community! Proverbs 3:27 reads, "*Don't hold back good from those who are worthy of it. Don't hold it back when you can help.*" What a wonderful witness of kindness and generosity to experience!

In June, **Close Knit Friends** will be working on baby blankets, booties, hats for the *Women Veterans Baby Shower*. We are also providing purple baby hats for the *Shaken Baby Syndrome* to bring awareness of the dangers of shaking a crying baby. Quilt Group News

Lutheran World Relief is delivering quilts to our brothers and sisters in Ukraine. Our Quilts are a Ministry of love to these Ukrainian families.

Several weeks ago, Sandi Christman saw a news story about LWR delivering quilts to Ukraine, and she recognized a quilt with fabric that we have used to make LWR quilts at Holy Cross. We believe that our quilts are reaching those in need in Ukraine.

From a recent LWR quilt newsletter:

"Kamins'ka and her son Svaitoslav found a place to stay in a health facility turned housing center for internally displaced Ukrainians—in the west of the country. LWR recently held a quilt distribution there, thanks to the love and support of donors like you. Residents receive the quilts with joy and appreciation. They have so very little and such generosity makes them feel like the community is welcoming them with "open arms."

"Since 2022 Lutheran World Relief has been continuously supporting six centers in Ukraine, sheltering families fleeing bombs, violence, and uncertainty. In total, we are subsidizing the cost of emergency housing for more than 15,000 people. Most arrive with only the clothing on their backs. The quilts that you so lovingly make surround our neighbors in these centers with just some of the physical comforts only home can provide."

Draft Declaration of Welcome and Affirmation:

We affirm that each person is a beloved and unique creation made in the image of God. We give thanks to God for the diversity of race, culture, ethnicities, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, physical and neuro diversity, socioeconomic status, family structure, background, and faith journey. We see all people as God's precious children and accept and celebrate all differences and gifts. We are committed to the work of loving one another, being intentionally welcoming, and inviting all home into this faith community. Following Christ's example, we strive for racial justice, avoid hurtful speech, actions, behaviors and love one another as God loves us. Here at Holy Cross, there is a place for you!

FAQ's:

1. Why do we need to have a welcome statement?
 - a. We want to be clear about who we are and what we believe at Holy Cross.
2. Why do we need to list all the diversity examples when we already say we welcome all?
 - a. Some people have been excluded, hurt, judged, scorned, ridiculed, guilted, expected to change, and/or ostracized for who they are by others with differing beliefs. We want our visitors and members to know that this is a safe place, and we strive to love others as Christ loves us.
3. What if we leave out a category of diversity with our listing?
 - a. We have tried to be as inclusive as possible but if we have missed something we hope you will tell us! This statement can be changed as needed, just like our mission and vision statements. Our statements are reviewed on a regular basis by our Church Council. Your input is always welcome and very important.
4. What does it mean if we affirm this statement?
 - a. By affirming this statement, we are agreeing that we believe each person is made in the image of God and we accept them and love them as God loves us. We are willing to work at loving others and welcoming them into our family. We want to be caring in our words and actions and be open to conversations about differences in order to better understand one another.
5. How are we "striving for racial justice"?
 - a. We look for ways to serve the needs of our community despite any racial or ethnic differences. We also support a number of local and global organizations that serve various ethnic groups. We recognize there are always opportunities to grow.

At this point we feel we are ready to present the congregation with this welcome statement at the mid-year annual meeting for affirmation. We have met with a number of you in small groups, disseminated information in the newsletter, held a hot topic meeting, encouraged your input and questions, created educational posters. We feel there is agreement with and acceptance of the statement as a reflection of who we are at Holy Cross. Please contact us or Pastor Kathy if you have any questions or concerns.

Supporting Aging Seniors: Hospice Care and Memorial & Funeral Planning A Senior Transitions Program

This one day program is offered Tuesday June 20, 10 a.m. to 12 noon in the Fellowship Hall at Holy Cross.

Supporting Aging Seniors is designed for Seniors, their families and support networks, to learn about and explore issues Seniors experience as we age.

During this session we will learn about the services provided by Hospice Care, as we move into the final time of our lives, and how to plan for Memorial or Funeral Services. We will have a speaker from a Hospice company and our own Pastor Kathy will discuss Memorial and Funeral Planning.

It is human nature to put off or even ignore life's difficult times and decisions. The challenges of aging may intimidate us and conversations between parents and adult children or seniors and loved ones are avoided. In the worst case scenario, no discussion has taken place and no plans are made until a crisis hits. Our Senior Transition Programs provide a safe, comfortable place and time to learn about and discuss issues of aging.
