We knit and crochet simple hats, scarves, blankets, and other items of warmth and comfort for local organizations. In 2023, we were able to donate over 1500 items to babies, children, and adults facing life challenges such as hospitalization, poverty, sexual exploitation, addiction, and domestic violence. We are happy to teach you the skills to get you started on a project on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of the month from 1-2:30 pm. OR you are welcome to donate washable acrylic or cotton yarn or funds to purchase the yarn we use for these projects. We also accept clean, gently used items too! A special workshop has been set up on Monday, January 29 at 1pm with Becky to crochet Octopus for Preemies. These light, bright, colorful, soft cotton toys are donated to the Renown Hospital NeoNatal Unit along with the Holy Cross Quilters baby quilts each year. The 8" long Octopus with its curled up tentacles distracts the babies from pulling on the tubes and cords attached to them. We will be using 100% cotton and size G/6 (4.25) crochet hooks. The Quilt Group meets every Thursday 9:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall.

During our quilt meetings we do a variety of things, cutting fabrics, designing quilt tops, sewing quilt tops, pressing the material, coordinating tops and backs and tying the quilts—something for everyone!
