Dear Friends,

I was reading through my Bible this morning and I came across a passage that hit home for me today, and I wanted to share it with you:

"Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? ... Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own." – Matthew 6:26-27; 34, NIV

I share this with you because I've been having conversations lately with people who are trying not to worry. Many of these have involved health concerns and the waiting that happens when people have tests done. Others are worrying about kids and grandkids. God loves you and God wants to carry the burden that you worry about. It one of the many ways that God walks with us through all of the joys, the sorrows and the worries of life!

All Saints Sunday



Reformation Sunday is October 29, please plan to wear red as we celebrate the work of the Holy Spirit reforming the church of the past as well as the church of the present!



In September we "wrapped up our "Quilt Year". On Sunday, September 24 we blessed our quilts, the Sanctuary was a rainbow of color, art, and caring. This year Holy Cross Quilters are giving away more than 225 quilts. Since the quilt group began seventeen years ago, we have given away 2000 quilts!!

The "fun begins when we distribute our quilts, locally to Veterans in Transition--for Veterans getting established in their own homes, Washoe County School District, Children in Transition—helping homeless students in our School District; Ronald McDonald House—supporting families of children who are hospitalized; Hosana Home -helping women regain their lives; and the Children's Cabinet—helping children in our community, Women's Children Center of the Sierra, helping women and children move from poverty to self-sufficiency, the Empowerment Center helping women recovery from addiction, Renown Neo-Natal Intensive Care Unit and through Lutheran World Relief, we send our quilts to our brothers and sisters in need around the world. We also are blessed to provide a comforting quilt to congregation members, friends, and neighbors in need of support and comfort.

Thank you to everyone who participates and supports the Quilt Group's outreach ministry of Holy Cross. A special thank you to Pastor Kathy for delivering our quilts to the LWR In Gathering in California

We dedicate our quilts to Christ's service, trusting that Christ's love will go wherever each quilt is sent, making it more than just a piece of material, making each quilt we have created an expression of love.

During October and November, we will be working on 24-inch small quilts that we will give to the Renown Neo-Natal Intensive Care Units for babies who are in the NICU units over the Holiday season.

Sierra Pacific Synod Assembly

September 15, 16, and 17 By Katie Torry

Katie Torry and Sandi Christman, (voting members) Peggy Ince, and Diane Torry (volunteers) attended the Synod Assembly in Burlingame CA Sept. 15,16,17.

The primary work of the Assembly was electing a new Bishop. Reverend Jeff Johnson was elected Bishop for a six-year term. The were 31 candidates who were nominated on the first ballot, and following discernment, and hearing from the candidates, and several ballots, Johnson was elected on the fifth ballot, with 226 votes to 168 votes for the Rev. John Kuehne, pastor of Unity Lutheran Church in South San Francisco and bridge pastor of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in San Mateo, Calif. Johnson is the first openly gay man to be elected bishop in the synod.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of the University Lutheran Chapel of Berkeley and as a member of the Spiritual Care Team at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, Berkeley, since 2013. Previously he served as pastor of First United Lutheran Church in San Francisco (1990-1999), as a mission developer for Lutheran Lesbian and Gay Ministries in San Francisco (1990-1995), as HIV education director for Lutheran Social Services of Northern California (1988-1989), as assistant night minister for San Francisco Night Ministry (1987-1988), and was an intern at the Lutheran Office of Public Policy and at First English Lutheran Church in Sacramento (1986-1987).

Johnson received his Bachelor of Arts in history and Bachelor of Arts in German from California Lutheran University, Thousand Oaks, in 1984, and his Master of Divinity from Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in 1988. Johnson was ordained in 1990. Pacific is one of seven ELCA seminaries.

Other activities of the Assembly included electing Synod council members, passing the annual budget, welcoming La Iglesia Luterana Santa Maria Peregrina Congregation into the Synod, beautiful music, Worship, workshops, and a banquet with a Jazz band and dancing!

We enjoyed being part of conducting Synod business, meeting others from across the Synod and helping make this year's Assembly successful and joyful.

Fun Facts: University Lutheran offers Godly Play as their Sunday School program, Peggy Ince escorted Rev. Johnson to the breakout sessions during the balloting process, and Diane Torry served on the Bishop's Election Committee.
