

#### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

We've been having a debate in my house, when can we start getting ready for Christmas? When can we decorate? When can we watch the Christmas movies? When can we listen to Christmas music? The standard answer is the day after Thanksgiving, but this year, Thanksgiving was so late, so it was causing some confusion, especially among the kids. If it was up to my daughter, we would have had the tree up the day after Halloween, but my son wants to make sure Thanksgiving gets its own recognition. (I can see both sides of the issue and didn't want to tell them that I'm already listening to Christmas music.)

I've always appreciated that the church has the season of Advent to help us get ready for Christmas. I find I can get wrapped up in all of the "Christmas Stuff" and even the "Church Christmas Stuff" so the reminder of Advent as a period of intentionally waiting for Jesus to come brings peace to my mind and my heart.

As a church, Advent is always a busy season as there are lots of things happening and offered through the church. We do a lot of giving as we share gifts with children in the community, baby quilts and octopuses with children and families in the NICU, and more. We do a lot of socializing (and eating) as we gather for fellowship events like the Advent Tea, senior lunch, a youth swim day, and Christmas parties. We do a lot of community outreach as we host the Live Nativity and go out to Christmas carol. This year, we're adding a new event on Wednesday nights, an intergenerational activity night, where we'll have dinner, a Christmas story and create some special projects to enhance our season. While all of these events are fun and easy to invite people to, a highlight for me in Advent is always worship. This year I'm going to be preaching a sermon series called, "Love Comes" which emphasizes different ways the love of God comes to us. I'm hopeful it's going to the pause and the reminder that we need as we wait and ready our hearts for the coming of Jesus.

# **Quilt Group News**

On Sunday, December 1 a special blessing will be part of our Worship Services. Fifty-six small quilts, fifty-six crocheted octopi will be blessed and then given to the Renown Neo Natal Intensive Care Unit.

Several years ago, the Quilt group was asked by Renown NICU to make small Christmas quilts for the babies that will be in the NICU over the Christmas Season. The Renown NICU performs life-giving work with preemie babies for several weeks following their birth. This is a very difficult time for the parents and family, as they see their little ones hooked to tubes and machines— life-giving but scary and institutional, with no touch of home. The Christmas quilts keep the preemie babies warm, fitting over their tiny bodies in the isolates. Close Knit Friends crocheted the octopus and our children and quilters "stuffed" the octopi and sewed them together and made octopi "faces". The octopi are used to distract the babies from pulling on their multiple lifegiving tubes. The little quilts and octopi, in a sterile, light-blinking, machine-



whooshing world, provide a sense of security and normalcy for the parents. The quilts and octopigo home with the babies when they are discharged.

Making these quilts and octopi is a special time for Holy Cross Quilters and Close Knit Friends. When we were first asked, we didn't know if we could complete the project—but we agreed to try. Now each year we look forward to starting our "quilt year" by making these special gifts for babies and families in our community—as we design, cut, iron, sew, crochet, and "stuff" we are blessed to be able to work together to bring comfort and joy to babies and families — a visible way of sharing Christ's love during the Christmas Season as we celebrate Christ's birth.







Don't forget our Live Nativity happens on December 13 and 14. We are looking for a lot of helpers for this community event.


Our children's program will be Sunday, December 15 at the 10:30 Service. Play practice is Saturday, December 13 from 10-12.
