
Youth News

Quilt Group News

The Artown Quilt and Music show will be held July 20 12:30 to 4 p.m. If you would like to enter a quilt in the Artown Quilt show or have a friend who would like to show their quilts, let us know—entry forms for the July 20th show are now available from any quilter or in the Church office. Mark your calendar for this wonderful event—quilts and music. Raffle tickets on a beautiful quilt will be available during the event. The proceeds support our Quilt work at Holy Cross. Plan to attend and bring a friend.

We are completing altar and pulpit cloths, in the Cathedral Windows pattern. The partially completed cloths were given to us by Tia Cobb. The quilted Cathedral Window projects were nearly completed by her mother Gertie Ritterby. At her passing Tia graciously donated them to Holy Cross. These Altar and Pulpit cloths are beautiful, they will be blessed and dedicated, shown at the July 20 Artown Quilt and Music show and then used periodically throughout the year on the Altar and Pulpit. The Cathedral Window pattern is a traditional quilt block design inspired by stained glass windows. It is created by using a folding technique where the fabric is folded to create a "window" effect with a contrasting fabric square inside the "window". The first documented use of Cathedral Windows in a quilt appeared at the Chicago World Fair in 1933 and rapidly became popular in the US.

We are "hard at work' (sometimes with coffee and donuts) every Thursday, making quilts to give to our neighbors in need in our local community and around the world. We would love to have you join us.
